School of Sanctuary Award

This year we have started the process of becoming a School of Sanctuary.

A Sanctuary school will receive a Sanctuary Award from City of Sanctuary UK in recognition of its good practice in fostering a culture of welcome, belonging and solidarity for those seeking safety.

There is a three stage process to accreditation:

LEARN Schools help their students, staff and wider community learn about what it means to be seeking sanctuary and the issues surrounding forced migration.

EMBED Schools are committed to creating a safe and inclusive culture of welcome that benefits everybody, including anyone in their community seeking sanctuary.

SHARE Schools share their values and activities with their local communities.

We will be fully starting the first part of the process during Refugee Week in June with lots of workshops and a special guest speaker! We will keep you updated on the progress and learning the children are participating in.
