# A MESSAGE FROM THE COLLABORATIVE LEARNING TRUST:

There have been further developments of our Trust since we last updated parents and carers. As well as Trinity All Saints Church of England Primary School in Bingley and Ashfield Primary School in Otley joining the Trust (in July and September respectively) we have increased our Central Team to include a SEND specialist, to help develop provision for all our SEND pupils across the Trust.

Our governor networks have expanded with SEND, Safeguarding and Chair of Governors' meeting termly, to support and develop a collaborative culture across our schools. Staff networks have also grown, with the addition of more Subject Networks for teaching staff and some Associate Staff networks (such as HR and Office Manager Teams).
